

The Urban Lab : Innovating for Density and Scarcity

The growth of the urban population in cities is an inexorable trend that will perpetuate for many decades to come. For Singapore, the challenges are exacerbated multi-fold given that it is an island city state that is highly land and resource constrained. However, Singapore has often been cited as a beacon of urban innovation, effectively transforming its limitations to opportunities. As an urban laboratory, Singapore has pioneered many unique urban solutions in land use and urban design, green infrastructure and public housing.

The lecture will piece together the multi-faceted efforts and distil the thinking behind many of the urban transformations that have shaped our lived experience in Singapore.
